

Cancer Free Challenge FAQs

Campaign Specific

What is Cancer Free Challenge?

Cancer Free Challenge is a high value recognition program that invites fundraisers who have raised \$10,000 or more the previous year, to participate in this program. This is an invite only program, uniting our most passionate fundraisers who we know have the power to make a difference.

This is an all-year fundraising campaign & participants commit to raising \$10,000 across 2 or more events.

Participants can raise funds themselves and/or recruit other teams and fundraisers to get involved on their behalf. All funds raised on behalf of the Cancer Free Challenge participant can be applied to their registration and attributed to their total fundraising.

Why Cancer Free Challenge – what are the benefits?

- Join a community of the most engaged and passionate supporters who are committed to a cancer free future
- Make a difference to the thousands of Queenslanders affected by cancer annually
- You will have the authority to act on behalf of Cancer Council Queensland within your community
- You will receive a Champion Kit, including a business card template, tailored fundraising guide and other resources
- Online recognition via Cancer Council Queensland website & on social media
- Invitation to our regional end of year Thank You celebrations where you will be recognised as a Cancer Free Champion & be recognised for your efforts
- Exclusive VIP benefits & ongoing recognition

What support will CCQ provide?

Tailored and dedicated resources will be provided to all entrants at the start of the campaign, with all tools and resources included to help achieve their fundraising goals.

Throughout the campaign, CCQ partner (Community Engagement team member) will check in with all entrants and collate updates on how entrants are tracking, how their fundraising is going & what events they plan to/have registered for. All check ins will include record taking for reference and actioning as required.

Participation/Registrations

How can someone support Cancer Free Challenge?

You can support Cancer Free Challenge in a number of ways.

- **Register for a CCQ fundraising campaign** & advise CCQ that you have registered after speaking to the Cancer Free Challenge participant.
- **Donate to your friend, family member or colleague** who is registered for Cancer Free Challenge

How do people register?

Fundraisers who have raised \$10,000 (or more) will be invited to join Cancer Free Challenge. Fundraisers who meet the criteria will be automatically invited & registered for this program. All selected participants are able to opt out of the campaign if they don't wish to join.

Do I need parental/guardian approval to participate?

Yes, to register a participant under the age of 18, we need parental or guardian approval to register for any campaign completed as part of Cancer Free Challenge.

When accepting the Terms and Conditions for each individual campaign in the registration process, entrants under the age of 18 are required to have a parent or guardian read and accept the Terms and Conditions on their behalf.

How do I register as a school?

All registrations are completed by CCQ when the supporter is opted into Cancer Free Challenge. There is a 'school' role as part of the registration options. Any school that is registered will be under this category.

Where do the raised funds go?

Supporters' money goes directly to Cancer Council to help our work to free the future from cancer. This includes our practical support services, funding research and providing confidential information through 13 11 20.

What do I do with funds once raised?

All funds raised as part of Cancer Free Challenge must be banked against the campaign that the funds have been raised through. Funds can be raised via participating in any CCQ event such as:

- Do It For Cancer
- Australia's Biggest Morning Tea
- Daffodil Day
- Relay for life
- Ponytail Project
- The Longest Day
- Pink Ribbon
- Girls' Night In

All funds raised through campaigns must be banked using the deposit slip provided in the host kit received upon registering for the individual campaign/event.

How do I bank cash donations?

After supporters have completed the campaign/s they have registered for, there are a number of easy ways to bank your funds.

- **Visit your local NAB branch** with your deposit slip included in your fundraising kit
- **Deposit your funds** to the following account:
 - o Bank Name: National Australia Bank
 - o Account Name: Cancer Council Queensland
- Account BSB: Please use the BSB number in the welcome letter for the relevant campaign that the funds were raised for (i.e., if you fundraised for ABMT, please use the BSB provided in the ABMT Welcome Letter you received)
- Account Number: Please use the account number provided in the welcome letter for the relevant campaign that the funds were raised for (see above example)
- Reference: Please use your agent number located at the top of your welcome letter as our reference

Make sure that the funds raised are banked against the campaign they have been raised through (as above), once received they will be attributed to the supporters Cancer Free Challenge profile.
